Re: Upper North Fork Feather River Project, FERC Project No. 2105

Dear Ms.Bose,

I have been a resident of Plumas County and of the Lake Almanor basin since 1988. The health of Lake Almanor is critical to the survival of our community. For almost 20 years we have been living with uncertainty about the outcome of this licensing project. We had a good agreement, one that had been arrived at through hours of dedicated effort by the primary stakeholders. That collaborative effort resulted in agreement that would have monitored the lake quality, the lake level, the flows and the health of the fishery. It would have provided an increase in community facilities and much more. This collaborative agreement was torpedoed by special interest group within the State Water Resources Control Board who introduced a last-minute demand for a 3° temperature change 9 miles down stream.

For this reason I ask that during your review of the Project 2105 licensing you do the following:

Honor and uphold the April 22, 2004 Settlement Agreement filed on behalf of the Project 2105 Licensing Group addressing reservoir lake levels, stream flows below project dams, water quality monitoring, wildlife habitat enhancement and recreation enhancements.

Not allow any additional releases of cold water from Lake Almanor beyond that agreed to in the 2004 Settlement Agreement. The quality of water in Lake Almanor and the health of our fisheries are critical to our economy, our businesses and the quality of life of the families in our community.

Thank you for considering my request as you review the Project No. 2105 Licensing.
