
Dear, Secretary Kimberly Bose,

We're writing about the process of the re-licensing of Lake Almanor Ca., which has been over a fourteen year process. Twenty years ago the residents of Lake Almanor were told that the lake would remain unchanged by our Plumas County Commissioners, now we are being told that the commissioners didn't finish their job. So we are asking for your support of the Project 2105 Settlement Agreement and hope that the license will be issued ASAP and include water released in the original Settlement Agreement. The promises and good faith negotiations that were in the settlement agreement for the 2105 should be upheld without change! For the State Water Resource Control Board to change a single intent of the collaborative 2105 agreement is wrong and should not be considered by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission.

We are now back to square one with the high possibility of water being taken from our lake by a special interest group.

Plumas County can best be described as a "poor" non-influential county in California; Limited resources, limited services, with no influence with the Sacramento political system, so it is an easy target to take away a resource, (Lake Almanor), which is one of few means that the county has to help its economy. By reducing our lake water you are reducing the number of people that will come to this lake for fishing and recreation. This results in a loss of income for the residents of Plumas County.
