RE: Upper North Fork Feather River Project, FERC Project No. 2105

Ms. Bose,

We are new residents of Chester, CA and have become aware of a most concerning issue for our community. There is a proposal added to the Project 2105 Licensing (started back in 2004) of our lake that requires cold water to be drained from the bottom of our Lake Almanor and to have it sent downstream 9 miles...the unproved goal of cooling water 3degrees for fish downstream. The other actual proven result is the demise of our lake with higher temperatures, algae bloom, dead fish, and devastated livelihoods of thousands of folks in this community surrounding beautiful Lake Almanor.

During your review of the Project 2105 Licensing, we ask that you do the following:

Honor and uphold the April 22, 2004 Settlement Agreement filed on behalf of the Project 2105 Licensing Group addressing reservoir lake levels, stream flows below project dams, water quality monitoring, wildlife habitat enhancement, and recreation enhancements.

Not allow any additional releases of cold water from Lake Almanor beyond that agreed to in the 2004 Settlement Agreement. The quality of water in Lake Almanor and the health of our fisheries are critical to our economy, our businesses and the quality of life of the families in our community.
